President's Message



We now approach our second full year of operations and I must say that we collectively have taken successful strides towards achieving our mandate. Our mandate is to provide medical services, equipment and treatment for children with facial deformities where medical funding may be limited or unavailable. In the last few months, the Foundation has made a firm commitment to British Columbia Children's Hospital to provide them with a speech diagnostic equipment called a "Nasometer" valued at approximately \$6,000. This equipment will provide bio-feedback information for a child during speech therapy.

The Foundation is also looking closely at a family from Okanagan who may need financial support for their two children suffering from ectodermal dysplasia, a hereditary disease that leaves small, pointy teeth. We are in a position to provide this funding only through the generous help that the Foundation has received and continues to receive from families, friends, business associates, corporations and other organizations.

OSBWCF has planned several fund raising events for 2003 and we look forward to your continued support in these events. Together, we can achieve our goal "... helping children smile ... one smile at a time."

Imagine your feelings as a parent if your 6 year-old cried every morning because she didn't want to go to school. Imagine your feelings as a parent if your 8 year-old came home from school crying because the other children teased him and excluded him from their games because he had an obvious facial difference. Imagine your frustration as a parent if you watched your child become painfully shy, isolated, quiet and non-verbal because her speech was so difficult to understand that no-one could. Imagine how helpless you would feel if this was your child.

For children who are born 'looking or speaking different' or for those children who have acquired a facial difference or difficulties with their speech as a result of an accident or disease, these situations can become a family's reality. Looking different or having a speech difficulty in our society can have a significant impact on a child's life. Common social situations like the start of school, acting in a play, making friends, going to a high school dance, or playing on a sports team can become huge hurdles for many children and their families.

The goals of treatment are complex and focus on the child's appearance, communication skills (speaking and hearing), physical health, learning needs and self-esteem. All equally important to the children as they make their way along the path of their life. Surgery, hospital visits, orthodontic visits and therapy becomes a 'way of life' for the child and family until adulthood. The 'team care' approach helps families adjust and adapt to the journey.

The whole team wishes to thank the Operation Smile Because We Care Foundation for their very generous support of these children. The funds allocated to our program are being used to purchase a specialized piece of speech bio-feedback testing equipment called a Nasometer. This equipment will be used to assist children during speech therapy sessions, by making it possible for the child to watch a computer screen that shows them how well they are improving as they practice the speech sounds that are being worked on during the session. This bio-feedback is a huge motivator for children and their families and gives excellent, measurable feedback and information to the speech therapist at the time of the therapy.
